What a blessing.

just a few blocks away, to train 6 teens to run on a special culinary track. We are so proud of these culinary interns. Each week I worked with them to pick out recipes, give each dish a creative name and properly set dinner tables. **Ann Orielly** taught them to design and hand-craft their very own menus and **Teresa May** and **Helena Giunta** where our excellent head chefs that coached the kids step by step. By the end of each week the kidz were ready to serve 12 local business leaders the lunch they had prepared from appetizers to desserts. I must say that this culinary track was so successful and seemed to get better each week. We barely scratched the surface of what they could learn. Our plans are to continue the track the rest of the year by the grace of God.

With that we could give vision and purpose to each intern, a doable weekly allowance and take the rest of the kidz to several nice places for fun and activities. THANK YOU "STEWARTS" FOR BELIEVING IN OUR MISSION! We used every cent just for KIDZ like we promised.

All of you are partners in this mission. No matter how many volunteers there are, without your financial support we would not be able to do what we do. It's that simple. Just to have a place for the kidz is \$1300 a



month for rent gas and electric. It's mandatory for us to have insurance on the building and mission of \$81.80 per month. The kids computer lab internet only is \$59.94 per month. We maintain one vehicle with no loan payment thanks to "Triumph Knitting Company" and Steve Gerber. Our monthly Vehicle insurance is \$166.95. This summer we bought 4 new tires totaling \$588.00 with the help of Vincent Rizzi Sr. We had breaks, rotors, air conditioning repair, inspection, oil change and more at a very big discount at "Morehead Honda" through the help of Brian Morehead. We need help to put this bill behind us. If anyone could help it's \$575.96. These



expenses do not include operating supplies, monthly newsletter, fuel for the vehicles that pick up donated groceries four days a week all over the Hudson Valley, or any compensation to any individuals. Our Mission's vehicle alone is no less than \$200 per month in fuel. No one was given any compensation over the summer including Pastor Rosey and Teresa because it just wasn't

there to allot. This was a big sacrifice for them. Most of our fundraisers during the summer were rained out. We did not take the kids to NYC to the Statue of Liberty. We budgeted what we had to get through the summer with the Kidz to make sure they were kept busy and off the streets.

Your prayers for all the volunteers that sacrifice their time energy and money among us would be a blessing. Pray that the Lord would continue to supply all our needs and use us in such a way that His steadfast love would anchor the hearts of the Kidz. It's our hearts that they can weather the storms in their lives without repeating past cycles of brokenness they come from. With every prayer and dollar, you entrust us with it gives us a chance to rescue another life.
